

#### **MINORS**

- Minors may attend the function
- No person under the age of 18 may purchase, handle, serve or consume liquor
- A minor may not sell liquor tickets
- A person who appears to be under 25 years of age must provide government-issued identification to request or possess liquor
- A minor may be employed as kitchen or service help

#### LIQUOR SERVICE

- Spirits (such as whisky and vodka) must be served by the individual drink. A person may not be given or sold a bottle of spirits
- Any liquor provided or sold at the event must be purchased from an Alberta retail store, general merchandise liquor store, or off-sales room
- The licence holder must have receipts at the event for all liquor provided or sold at the event
- You may set your own drink prices with a Private Resale Licence. Prices need to be posted and apply to individual drinks only.
   Price specials for multiple orders are not allowed (e.g. two drinks for the price of one)

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTIONS**

- Failure to comply with the Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis Act, Gaming, Liquor and Cannabis Regulations and policies can result in a fine
- Sanctions can range from \$250 to \$10,000

#### **EXAMPLES OF VIOLATIONS**

- Giving or selling liquor to a minor
- Permitting, selling or providing liquor to a person intoxicated by liquor or a drug
- Allowing homemade liquor
- Removing liquor from the licensed area
- Hindering, obstructing, or impeding inspector(s) or police
- Allowing any unsafe activity
- Selling or providing liquor during hours or days not specified on the licence
- Providing prohibited entertainment
- Allowing any activity that is contrary to any municipal bylaw or any Act or Regulation of Alberta or Canada

# Special Event Liquor Licences

for Private Functions



#### WHAT IS A PRIVATE SPECIAL EVENT LICENCE?

A special event liquor licence is a legal document which allows the holder to host a function with liquor service.

#### **SUITABLE LOCATIONS**

Include community halls, banquet and meeting rooms, fenced areas, and tents (with municipal approval).

#### MAXIMUM LIQUOR SERVICE HOURS

From 10:00 am to 2:00 am. Consumption may not exceed one hour after liquor service ends.

#### **FOOD & NON-ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**

- Non-alcoholic beverages are required
- Food service is recommended

#### ADVERTISING THE EVENT

- All advertising must state that the event is for members and invited guests only
- A business outlet or public venue may not sell tickets to the public for a private event



### **Types of Special Event Licences for Private Functions**

#### YOU MAY GET A LICENCE IF:

- You are 18 years of age or over
- You represent a non-profit organization, a municipality, or a business
- You are an individual planning a private function such as a wedding, anniversary or family reunion
- The event is for invited guests only

## LIQUOR SOLD TO GUESTS

- You need a Private Resale Licence
- Fee \$25

#### LIQUOR PROVIDED FOR FREE TO GUEST

- You need a Private
  Non Sale Licence
- Fee \$10
- You can obtain a licence at www.aglc.ca

#### PRIVATE RESIDENCE

- You do not need a licence if your event is at a private residence
- No sale of liquor is allowed in a private residence

#### YOU CANNOT GET A LICENCE IF:

- The event is open to the general public
- A liquor licence already exists at the location where you want to hold the function
- The AGLC has suspended the liquor licence at a licensed premises

## IF THE EVENT IS OPEN TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC:

- Contact the AGLC at 780-447-8846 or toll free at 1-800-272-8876 ext. 8846 to apply for a Public Special Event Licence
- Ensure you notify the AGLC four to six weeks in advance of your event

#### THINGS TO BE AWARE OF

- The licence must be posted
- AGLC inspectors and police must be allowed to enter your event
- Do not allow any unsafe activity
- Homemade wine, beer or cider cannot be sold or served
- Nude entertainment is prohibited
- Do not exceed the maximum occupancy load at the location of your event
